Many of our division's complaints and enforcement actions stem from unpermitted shoreline structures. Many properties with coastal violations are sold without disclosure of the enforcement item, and the new property owner unknowingly inherits the violation.

The goal of the Coastal Property Owner's Guide is to help familiarize current and potential property owners, real estate agents, attorneys, builders, and anyone involved in selling or buying coastal properties, with coastal structures and regulations.
